SUPERVISED STUDY RULES & REGULATIONS

Please read carefully as these are **strictly** adhered to.

1. **PUNCTUALITY:** Students must be present in the study room **at least 5 minutes before each session.** Students are not allowed to enter the study hall once a study period has commenced but may enter or leave study during the breaks. All late students will be asked to leave the premises by the supervisor and must have a note explaining their absence at the next study session that they attend, if they have ticked “Option One”.
2. Students are not permitted to pass notes or books to another student during the study period. If a student wishes to borrow a book or have a discussion with another student this should be done before study commences and during the breaks.
3. Pupils are not allowed to use MP3 players, mobile phones, laptops i-pads etc. during study. These will be confiscated and pupils will be sent home.
4. Chewing gum or crisps are not allowed in the study rooms.
5. Any student considered to be interrupting or interfering in any way with any study session will be sent home. Any student who is sent home from study for any reason may not be allowed back into supervised study in the future.
6. **ABSENTEEISM:** Please read carefully the two available options in relation to attendance detailed elsewhere in this booklet and select which option best suits you and your son/daughter. **Any student on “Option One” who is found to be forging notes for non-attendance may be asked to permanently leave the College and at the very least asked to change to Option Two re attendance**
7. Students are solely responsible for all of their personal belongings. Déise College will not accept responsibility for damage to/loss of such belongings.
8. Each student is responsible for their own area in the study room; in particular for tidiness of their area.
9. To ensure an effective study environment students must sit in the seat allocated to them and they are not allowed to leave their desk during a study session.
10. Déise College is not responsible for students who leave the premises for whatever reason.
11. The College should be advised of any relevant medical conditions by detailing them on the bottom margin of the application form.
12. Photos and video footage may be taken for promotional reasons.
13. The College reserves the right to adapt or amend these rules as it sees fit.

SUPERVISED STUDY AT DÉISE COLLEGE

ATTENDANCE

The College will not be responsible for students not presenting themselves for study.

To facilitate the smooth running of study and to allow parent/guardian to monitor their son/daughter's attendance at study, parents have two options which are outlined below.

Both options are successfully in operation at the College. Please decide which option best suits you and tick the appropriate box on the relevant application form.

However, we strongly recommend Option One, as from past experience, we have noticed that this motivates students more to attend and absenteeism rates amongst “Option Two” students are a lot higher than “Option One” students.

OPTION 1

Parent/guardian provides a note explaining their awareness of the student's non-attendance at a study session. This note must be presented at the next session that the student attends, this prevents “dossing”. **Text/phone messages or phone calls are not accepted instead of a note. If the student does not provide the note they will not be allowed into the session.** They will be allowed on a one off basis to sit in reception if somebody is unable to collect them. This cannot happen on a consistent basis or the student will be asked to move to Option 2. This system is strictly adhered to and no exceptions will be made. We then know that parents are aware that their son/daughter was not at Déise College at the required time. **Any student on “Option One” who is found to be forging notes for non-attendance may be asked to permanently leave the College and at the very least asked to change to “Option 2” re attendance.**

OPTION 2

A parent/guardian may decide with their son/daughter to monitor their attendance together, therefore, an attendance record will not be kept for these students and **notes will not be required for non-attendance.**

CREDIT/PAYMENT POLICY IN RELATION TO SUPERVISED STUDY

The College has a **policy of not giving credit** and to this end all supervised study must be paid for at reception before study commences each week/Saturday. It is also possible to pay for a number of weeks/Saturdays or a term of supervised study in advance; again payment for this should be made at reception. In relation to evening study, **if a student is present on Monday and does not pay they will owe €16 on Tuesday and an extra euro for each day thereafter.** This policy has been implemented successfully in the past and it ensures that students do not forget their money.

If your son/daughter is missing from study for a week/Saturday for **any** reason, they will owe for two weeks/Saturdays the following week/Saturday, as their seat is allocated to them for the year and we guarantee that nobody else can take their place. **The deposit cannot be used to pay for the week missed as all student records must be kept up to date.**

From past experience, we strongly recommend that a student remains in supervised study until the end of the school year. This, in conjunction with the rules as outlined, are vital for the creation and maintenance of an effective study environment for your child. If a student, for whatever reason, is unable to continue with supervised study, **four weeks notice in writing** is required for evening study (six weeks for Saturday study). The deposit can then be offset against the following four weeks (six weeks for Saturday study).

Places are limited and it is advisable to complete the relevant form and return it with the **required fee** to the College if your son/daughter is interested in participating in supervised study at the College.

GRINDS

Grinds (one hour in duration) will run on a **weekly** basis costing **€20** per grind. A deposit of **€60** per subject is required to secure a place in a grind. This deposit will be offset against the last three weeks of the grind at the end of the school year.

The College provides grinds from first to sixth years. First and Second year is a good time to improve individual standards. Pupils find that they can solve any problem areas early. Third, fifth and sixth year grinds are exam focused. Transition years often opt to get a head start in subjects before starting the Leaving Certificate programme in fifth year, particularly Honours Maths, Irish, Ag. Science, Spanish and Business (as an extra subject).

The teaching is of the highest calibre. All teachers have been hand picked for their vast teaching experience and their **ability to get the best out of students**. To this end, if a teacher feels that a student is not working to the best of their abilities, that student's parents will be contacted and if there isn't an improvement in that student's work ethic, then that student will be asked to leave the grind permanently. We feel that this is only fair to the parents, as some students think that a grind will solve all their problems in a particular subject but sometimes they forget that **they** have to do the work, not the teacher giving the grind. To this end, all home-work assigned by the teacher must be completed to the best of their ability; all relevant materials must be brought to each class and students must be in attendance punctually.

From past experience, we strongly recommend that a student remains in a grind until the end of the school year. Sometimes students think that they have learned a sufficient amount from a grind after a few months and drop out of the grind. However, each teacher has a programme and this programme runs until the end of May. Vital tuition will be missed if a student finishes up before that time.

The College policy is to keep classes small and to this end, the **maximum number** that will be in attendance at any stage throughout the year will be **eight**. However, the average class size varies between four and five.

If a student is missing for any reason, then he/she will have to pay for two weeks the following week. The deposit cannot be used to pay for the week missed as all student records must be kept up to date. The teacher will, however, inform the student as to what he/she covered in the grind. All deposits are used to cover the last three grinds at the end of the school year.

The College has a **policy of not giving credit**, and to this end, all grinds must be paid for to the teacher at the grind. It is also possible for a student to pay for a number of grinds in advance; again payment for this should be made to the teacher at the grind.

Should you decide that your son/daughter, for whatever reason, is unable to continue to attend a grind, **four weeks notice in writing must be handed to the grind teacher. The student must pay for the grind on the week that this notice is handed in and the deposit can then be offset against the following three weeks.** Conversely, if the number of students attending a grind drops below three the College reserves the right to give the remaining students four weeks notice to subsequently finish the grind.

On a rare occasion, a teacher may be unable to attend the grind due to circumstances outside their control (e.g. parent/teacher meeting in their school). In these cases, we will endeavour to inform you well in advance of any change in time or date of grind and the change will be made in consultation with pupils if this is possible. First Years

Oral Work: The approach to Irish is gradually changing in Secondary School to reflect the future increase in marks which will be awarded to Oral work in the Leaving Certificate. Consequently, the programme places a strong emphasis on developing the pupil's confidence and willingness to speak Irish by providing each pupil with every opportunity to speak the language in a fun way.

Vocabulary Building: The following themes are given as a guideline from the first year syllabus: *Mise Mé Féin*, *Mo scoil nua* (My new school), *M'áit chónaithe* (where I live), *An Baile Mór* (town), *An Aimsir* (the weather), *na séasúir* (the seasons) agus *Féilte na Bliana* (annual holidays), *An Corp agus sláinte* (health and the body), *Spórt* (sport), *Caithimh Aimsire* (past times).

In secondary school, there is a strong emphasis on **grammar and writing** skills. Therefore, we place a strong emphasis on these skills as part of our programme.
